

Drilling Is Underway


Game-Changer Details


- The accidental discovery of the Conglomerate Strata was the result of a drill hole made just to test the equipment. This surprise has since been called the "Chicken Coop Strata".
- Further down the slope, there is another such strata-- the "Old School House". At depth, there could be additional such structures.
- These names record that the reef at a kilometer or so, is wide enough for habitation.
- It also hosts the airstrip.
- As to the strike length, erosion by a creek has revealed a Conglomerate layer, some 17 kms along strike.
- The gold-colored band on the chart below is the record of gold production from South Africa. Which is essentially from the original Witwatersrand.




Details

- Witwatersrand Gold Geology, South Africa.
- Which since 1895, has produced some 40 percent of the gold ever mined in history.
- Cosigo Resources controls a Wits System in Colombia-Brazil. The unique geology has been confirmed by consultants in South Africa and in the US.
- In 2022, Colombia's Geology Department spent \$1 million evaluating banded iron formations on CSG's Claims.
- This is not directly important to CSG's Gold Story but shows government support for the region.
- Originally, Cosigo won over AngloGold-Ashanti in obtaining the claims.





• The Main Reef Is Some 50 Kms Long and 1Km Wide, with Cross Faults Hosting Secondary Mineralization.



- In a Wits System, The Best Grades are found in the Conglomerate Strata.
- Some CSG Bulk Samples have been in the Order of 30 G/T Au.

"Congratulations on the discovery of the conglomerate at a shallow depth!

If there is one gold target that I am very passionate about, it is conglomerate gold that is the key part of a Wits system. It is also perhaps the most elusive target of all. I tried to make it work in Australia, spending 15 years without finding the strata in the Pilbara. The gold is there, but in not the right strata it has been a complete headbang to evaluate it and mine it.

Does that discourage me from looking around at other possibilities? No. I really hope that you guys are on to something special. Congratulations on discovering the Wits-type conglomerate strata, which could be a gamechanger. We need a transformation in the gold mining industry that will ensure its longevity.
